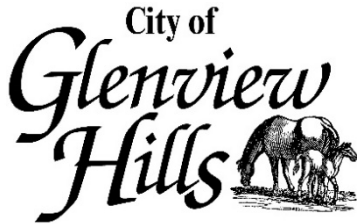

Accounting Contractor, Mr. Veeneman, presented the financial report. The Council discussed landscaping costs and the need to prioritize expenses, including maintenance of the new entrance planters and the potential addition of landscape lighting. Mr. Veeneman requested that the Council provide landscaping estimates so that these costs may be incorporated into the upcoming fiscal year budget.

The Council further discussed increased expenses associated with the new entrance project and expressed concern regarding the City's ability to fund additional obligations, including Flock cameras and Homeland Patrol security services.

The Council also addressed the need to establish a dedicated paving fund, noting that the current fund is not based on actual financial data. Mr. Veeneman agreed to assist the Council in developing a realistic 10–15 year paving cost analysis. Commissioner White will provide Mr. Veeneman with the most recent paving estimates for this purpose.

Mayor Green conducted the second reading of the Open Meetings Ordinance, which passed unanimously.

The Council revisited the issue of adopting a nuisance ordinance and requested that Attorney Spenard review the City's deed restrictions to assist in drafting an appropriate ordinance. Attorney Spenard agreed to evaluate the deed restrictions and determine which provisions may be enforceable through such an ordinance.

Commissioner Baker reported on a recent auction involving the cemetery lot.

The Council agreed that the City's website should be updated to include copies of the deed restrictions to ensure accessibility. Mayor Green requested that Attorney Spenard provide the documents for distribution to the Council and the website administrator.

The Council approved the December and January meeting minutes.

The Council expressed appreciation to Commissioner White for her coordination of the City's snow plowing and salting efforts. It was noted that Lime Road was not plowed during the recent snowstorm due to shared responsibility with Glenview Park and the presence of speed humps.

Mayor Green reported that she is preparing a city newsletter and requested that Council members submit any updates for inclusion.

Dr. Rowe provided a report on the League of Cities meeting he attended.
